How to get to Exarchia (where the NTUA, hotel Exarchion and Tsamadou 13 are)

I. by metro (faster):

Take metro **line 3** (blue) from airport, running from 6.30 to 23.00 every 30 minutes approximately. You change at <u>Syntagma station</u> and take **line 2** (red) direction Agios Antonios and get off at <u>Omonia station</u> (ticket 8 euros). Walk 6-10min. (see MAP)

2. by bus:

Take the bus **X95** from the airport (just outside arrivals) get off at the terminal station at Syntagma square. Buses run every 10 minutes during day and every 20 minutes the whole night (price 5 euro). From Syntagma you can either walk (20-25min), or take **metro line 2** to Omonia, or take **trolley lines 2,4,1** and get off the Polytechneio bus stop in front of the NTUA on Patission St., or take a **taxi** that will cost you around the minimum fare (3,20 euros) depending on traffic.

3. by taxi:

The standard price from the airport to the city centre (and your hotel) is 35 euros


